Marshall Passman of Mount Vernon VA passed away on Friday, July 31, 2020. Born October 18, 1930, in Brooklyn, NY, Marshall was the son of Edward and Lillian Heisler Passman. He was a graduate of Tilden HS and received a Bachelor of Science degree from Rutgers University (1952). After ROTC at Rutgers, Marshall was commissioned and served on active duty in the Army as an Ordnance Officer. He continued to serve in the Army Reserve until he retired in 1990 as a Lieutenant Colonel. His business career took him to Wall Street, Panama, and the Federal Highway Administration in Washington D.C. Through the years, he became an accomplished golfer and keen poker player via the Fort Belvoir Jewish Congregation Poker Group. In 2011, Marshall and Lois moved from their Riverside Estates home on Little Hunting Creek to The Fairfax retirement community. Marshall was looking forward to a 90th birthday virtual celebration in October and almost made it. He was preceded in death by his sister Myrna Handler. Marshall is survived by his devoted wife of 61 years, Lois M. Rosenthal, beloved son Leigh, daughter Pamela, and grandchildren Sarah and Emily Passman Guinee and David and Tom Passman, and loving extended family and friends.
