Adele Cynthia Levy, 87, of Charlottesville Virginia passed away peacefully on August 31st 2016 surrounded by family. Adele was born on November 15, 1928 in Brooklyn, New York to Sol and Rose Schneider. A lifelong lover of fine arts, Adele graduated from Brooklyn College with a degree in art, having studied under the famed abstract painter Ad Reinhardt. She carried this love of art throughout her life, creating original paintings and sculptures and dabbling in many other art forms. Adele married and had three children. In 1967 the family moved to Miami Beach where she worked in the hotel industry and for the City of Hollywood, Florida.

Adele moved to Frederick Maryland and later Charlottesville, Virginia to be closer to family and live with her daughter. While living in Frederick, she became active in her local synagogue. As a strong-willed feminist woman, Adele decided that since she had not been allowed to become a bat mitzvah as a young girl, she would do it at the age of 79. She studied the Torah, took classes, and finally became a bat mitzvah in front of her family, friends, and congregation in 2008. Adele enjoyed spending time at the Charlottesville senior center near her home, looking forward to her weekly Mahjong game with friends. Adele was a devoted mother and grandmother, and will be sadly missed by all.

Adele was preceded in death by her parents and brother Leonard. She is survived by her sons Richard (Patricia) Levy and Donald (Clara) Levy; her daughter Lisa Levy; and her grandchildren Ann Levy, Rachel (Sarah

Roenfeldt) Levy, Eyal Levy, and Ma'ayan Levy.

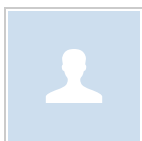
