May 11, 1934 - August 27, 2025

Arnold Leroy Kurtz, “Arnie” or “Dub” of Alexandria, Virginia passed away on August 27, 2025 at the age of 91. Arnie was born to Alfred and Lillian Kurtz in the booming metropolis of Whitetail, Montana. He and his family lived in Miles City, Montana for several years before relocating to Alexandria.

Arnie enlisted in the US Army, achieving the rank of SGT. He proudly served for a three-year tour in Japan during the Korean conflict. He then went on to a lifetime of sales. From real estate to appliances, from automobiles to fine men's attire and more; if it could be sold Arnie was the man to do it. He was a big fan of the Washington Commanders and an even bigger fan of the Nationals, often sharing his excitement with his family. His real passion, however, was his wife Lucile and their home. 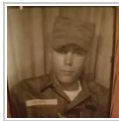
