



Betty Nan Levy Obermayer

January 1, 1932 - January 26, 2013

Betty Nan Levy Obermayer, 81, passed away on Saturday, January 26, 2013. Born in 1932 in New Orleans, Louisiana, to Neville and Helen Adler Levy, she is survived by her husband of 57 years Herman "Obe" Obermayer. She graduated from the Isadore Newman School in New Orleans, Stephens College in Missouri and received a certificate in Fund Raising Management from George Washington University. After marriage she moved to New Bedford, Massachusetts in 1955, to West Long Branch, New Jersey in 1957, where their four daughters were born. In 1971, she moved to Arlington, Virginia where she held various executive positions at the Northern Virginia Sun newspaper. She served as President of Temple Rodef Shalom from 1984 to 1986, a member of the Board of Directors of the Arena Stage, Washington, D.C. from 1977 to 1993 (Secretary from 1987 to 1993), and a trustee of the Jewish Foundation for Group Homes, Rockville, Maryland from 1987 to 2011. She was a longtime member of the Washington Golf and Country Club. Betty Nan was fond of saying her three favorite things were the 3 T's: Temple, Theater and Tennis. In addition to her husband, she is survived by her daughters Helen Levy-Myers and husband Eric of Reston, Virginia, Veronica Atnipp and husband Douglas of Houston, Texas, Adele Malpass and husband David of New York City, and Elizabeth Weintraub and husband Philip of Rockville, Maryland as well as 11 grandchildren.
