July 12, 1937 - March 10, 2019

Doris G. Gazin, 81, of Alexandria, passed away in her sleep on March 10 after a short illness.

Born Doris Rose Goldberg in Washington, DC on July 12, 1937, her parents were Ida (nee Deckelbaum) Goldberg and William David Goldberg.

A member of the Class of 1955 at George Washington High School in Alexandria, Mrs. Gazin earned a Thirty Years of Service award for her career working for the National Guard, and an Exceptional Performance of Duty award from the Department of the Army.

A longtime member of Agudas Achim Congregation, she was a member of Temple Rodef Shalom in Falls Church, Va at the time of her death.

Mrs. Gazin was an accomplished cook, and enjoyed making elaborate meals for her family. She was a 25 year breast cancer survivor and earned appreciation awards from Y-Me and Breast Cancer Network of Strength as a supporter and volunteer for breast cancer awareness. She was a supporter of 100 Women Who Care and longtime volunteer for Stop Child Abuse Now (SCAN) of Northern Virginia. She was a 50-year+ member of Jewish Women International and a Circle of Life Member of the United States Holocaust Memorial Museum.

Mrs. Gazin was married for 25 years to the late Max Gazin of Alexandria, VA. She leaves behind a brother, Louis Goldberg (Farideh), of Ashland, Mass.; two sons, Edward Mensh (Jean) of Alexandria, Va. and Mark Mensh (Laura) of Warrenton, Va. She also leaves her dearly loved grandchildren Liana

Mensh of Richmond and Daniel Lyster-Mensh of Warrenton. Also mourning her loss are her nieces Toby Schwartzman of Winchester, Mass. and Laura Robinson of Greenville, NC.

She was pre-deceased by a brother, Edward Goldberg, of Snohomish, Washington.

A graveside funeral service will be held at 11 a.m., Wednesday, March 13, at King David Memorial Gardens in Falls Church. A reception will be held immediately afterward at her residence, Goodwin House in Alexandria.
