



## Doris P. Schultz

May 9, 1920 - December 4, 2024

Doris Powell Schultz passed away peacefully in Alexandria, Virginia on Wednesday, December 4, 2024. She was 104 years old and filled her life with love and assistance to all she met.

She attended and graduated from Sidwell Friends School in Washington D.C. where her father taught math and Latin. Her parents also ran Mr. Sidwell's farm during the depression, supplying much of the milk and other food for the school. After school activities included being a good tennis player and keeping statistics for the baseball team.

During WWII, she worked at the Ryan Aeronautical Company office in DC and later at the Civil Aeronautics Administration and on the Hill. After having a family, she worked in several elementary schools in administration and their libraries.

With beloved husband Ruby Albert Schultz, Jr., they travelled to all 48 contiguous states and state capitals, were founding members of Aldersgate United Methodist Church where she taught the 4-year olds every Sunday during the church's early years, founded the church's library, and participated in the Women's Society.

Later in retirement, helped by her husband she became a genealogist, researching, reviewing, and giving programs about genealogy. She was an active participant in numerous historical organizations including the Daughters of the American Revolution, Colonial Dames of the 17th Century, Daughters of 1812, the Colonial Society of Daughters of the Indian Wars and other

organizations, studying and giving interpretive programs about local and American history. She also produced a wide variety of quilts and taught about quilting at the local seniors center.

Left to carry on her journey are daughters Sherryl and Yvonne, and many nieces, nephews, and their families.
