Eugene Louis Tougas, of Springfield, VA, formerly of Ft. Lauderdale, FL, Waltham and later Dennisport, MA passed peacefully on February 23, 2019. He was the beloved husband of the late Rose Marie Tougas; father of Anne Marie Dziob (Edward), Cecile Tougas, and Elaine Perricone (the late Joseph); grandfather of six and great-grandfather of eight. Gene served during WWII in the Army Air Corps and later retired as a Major with the Air Force reserves. He was active in the Builders Association of Greater Boston starting in 1948.
