I have known Ms. Eunice since 1990 when I was assigned to the Army Personnel Command at the Hoffman Building. I got to know her quite well â€“ our desks were separated by a temporary panel

room divider. She was always full of positive energy, always displayed a bright smile, and always had a sweet and recognizable laugh. I do not ever recall seeing her when she did not appear to be happy. The happiest I ever saw her was when I was at her side at RFK Stadium at the NFC Championship game in January 1992, the last time the Redskins advanced to the Super Bowl.
