Harold Lewis Novick of Alexandria, Virginia passed away on Friday, April 14, 2023. He is preceded in death by his parents, Esther Gordon and Samuel Novick. Harold is survived by his son, Martin Novick sister, Edith Willing, niece Stephanie Willing and Nephew Jeffery Willing.

Harold was born on December 29, 1942 in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania. He received his Bachelor of Science degree from Miami University of Ohio in Physics while enrolled in the ROTC program. Upon graduation, he joined the US Navy as a submarine nuclear physics engineer ultimately reaching the rank of Lieutenant. After leaving the US Navy, he received his law degree from George Washington University in 1972 and went on to work as a patent attorney in intellectual property law from many years.

Harold was a very well-traveled man forming bonds and friendships over all continents, really fitting the old navy recruitment slogan, "Join the Navy, see the world".
