“ *As luck would have it, Heather and I started as program officers at the NSF on the same day and were assigned offices next to one another. Over the years we learned together, laughed regularly, shared stories, and ratcheted up one another’s love of chocolate.*

Heather had so many qualities to love and admire. She was entirely committed to improving undergraduate education and supporting projects that provided opportunities for STEM learners. Her work ethic was matched only by her strong sense of fairness. All the while, she had a very clear work/life boundary.

Heather challenged conventional wisdom when she found it lacking - nowhere more so than in critiques of the “leaky pipeline” model used to explain STEM student retention. She thought that line of thinking did little to actually improve learning environments. Similarly, she demanded rigorous research and assessment plans that, again, were designed to benefit learners and push the boundaries of what we know about STEM learning and learning environments.

When the NSF moved locations, we made sure to request offices next to one another so that our daily conversations (and laughter and hijinks) could continue. Like so many others, I hoped that those conversations would continue over the years.
