Even in her final days when she would say she wasn't hungry, she would light up and eat food that she found interesting. Jasmine was pleased to be able to spend her final weeks at home in the neighborhood she loved receiving many visits, phone/video calls, well wishes, cards, and flowers from her friends and relatives before she passed away.
