Julius M. Lobo (70) of Springfield, VA passed away Thursday, October 9th, 2025. Beloved husband of Myrna Lobo and loving father to Kenneth, Benjamin, Nicholas, and James Lobo. Cherished brother of Jennifer, Joan, and Jude. He was preceded in death by his siblings, Jowitto and Freddy. He will truly be missed by many.

Julius was born on December 7th, 1954, in Dahanu, India to Joseph and Pauline Lobo. He spent his formative childhood years with his grandmother in Dharwad who raised him and adored him. After attending Wadia College in Pune, Julius earned his Bachelor of Pharmacy degree in Goa and then went on to Mumbai to work at his first job with the pharmaceutical manufacturing company Glaxo. He later moved to Saudi Arabia to work as a pharmacist before immigrating to the United States in 1992 to start a new life with his wife, Myrna. The two settled in Springfield, Virginia where they started a family and lived until the time of his passing.

Julius loved nature and visited numerous National Parks during his life. He was an avid cricket and soccer fan who was drawn to the Brazil National Team's style of play and lived to see them compete in World Cups. Julius was fond of Westerns and country music, often curating great soundtracks for family road trips.

Julius was a man of deep faith. He was active in the Saint Lawrence parish, having served as a member of the Knights of Columbus, a catechism teacher to young children, and a eucharistic minister. He lived for his family and friends. His legacy is that of love, devotion, and community and will be remembered by all who knew him.

Relatives and friends will be received at St. Lawrence Catholic Church, 6222 Franconia Rd, Alexandria, VA 22310 on Thursday October 16th, 2025 between 10 and 11am, followed by a funeral service at 11am. Following the service, there will be a reception held at the church from 12pm – 1:30 pm.
