Kenneth A. Conley, Sr. (Age 90)

On Tuesday, May 31, 2016, Kenneth A. Conley, Sr. died peacefully and unexpectedly at his home in Falls Church, Virginia. He resided in the Washington, D.C. area for 68 years.

Ken, the oldest of three brothers, was born March 8, 1926 in Jenkins, Kentucky - a small coal mining community. In 1945, he volunteered for the Army Air Force to become a pilot. After military service, he moved to Washington, D.C. to work for the federal government. He was a leader in the development of modern cost analysis and at the age of 32 became the chief of cost analysis for the U.S. Air Force. He retired in 1976.

After his retirement, Ken developed Coral Point, an intimate, waterfront community of twenty custom luxury homes, located near Stuart, Florida. Here, he built a remarkable family home that was enjoyed by family and friends for many years. During this time, he was also a private pilot, co-owned a single-engine plane, and flew all over the country.

Ken traveled extensively around the world with his family and friends. Recently, he returned from a tour of Southeast Asia and India, where he

visited the Taj Mahal for a second time.

In a committed and very close relationship for more than thirty years, Ken married Tom Miller in October 2014.

Ken is survived by his loving husband, Tom; three children from his previous marriage to Marian Rich Conley, Kenneth and his spouse, Leda, Kathryn and her partner, Randy, David and his spouse, Somer; three grandchildren, Justin Manning, his father, Keith, and his stepmother, Laurie, Spencer Conley, Kathryn A. Conley, and their mother, Laura S. Conley. His granddaughter, Malia Manning, predeceased him.
