Marie C. Boyle died January 28 at Mt. Vernon Hospital in Alexandria, VA.

Born on August 25, 1924 and raised on a farm outside Hanford, California in the heart of the San Joaquin Valley, she was the oldest of seven daughters born to Dutch immigrants Carl Chevallier and Margaret Van Lierop.

After completing her R.N. training in Santa Barbara, CA, she worked as a nurse for over sixty years, the last twenty of which were spent at DuPont Industries in Camden, SC. Following her retirement, she volunteered at the Camden Free Clinic.

Married to the late Lt. Col. John (Jack) M. Boyle, she loved the Air Force lifestyle, which took the family to Alaska, Florida, Illinois, Washington, DC, Maryland, and the Philippines. With her infectious, joyful spirit, she made friends wherever she went.

After her husband retired, they relocated to Camden, SC. In 2008 she moved to The Fairfax, a senior retirement community in Ft. Belvoir, VA, where she enjoyed spending time with her family and many friends, exercising and attending cultural events.

She is survived by her three children: Michael Boyle (Prill) of Westport, CT; Mary Prusaczyk (Keith) of Fairfax, VA; and Sylvie Chevallier of Boulder, CO; six grandchildren; three great-grandchildren; and five of her six sisters. One of her sisters, Cory Bryant, predeceased her.
