Mildred McDougal Lane, of Alexandria, Virginia passed away on Monday, October 11, 2021. She is preceded in death by her loving husband of 45 years, Anthony Lane Sr. and son, Anthony Lane Jr. She is survived by her daughter, Cathy Lane, daughter-in-law, Becky Lane, and brother, Charles McDougal.

Millie moved to DC from Tennessee to work as a secretary for the Navy when she was 18. Less than a year later she married Tony; they were married until his death in 1995. After her son Tom was born, she stopped working for the Navy and became active in politics including working at the polls at Rose Hill Elementary School. After both her children were in college, Millie went back to work for the Army and then The Department of Defense Dependent Schools.

Millie's friends were very important to her. She enjoyed their company and could often be found out to lunch with them or getting together with them at the house or talking to them on the phone. Until fairly recently, a group of her friends could be found at her house about once a month making pillows for heart patients. Those days were often the highlight of her month.

Millie also loved to travel and visited many places such as Alaska, England, The Dominican Republic and Canada. She also spent time at her beach house in Hatteras, North Carolina, often with beloved family members.
