



Morton S. Cohen

August 8, 1936 - June 5, 2023

Mort Cohen passed away June 5, 2023, at the age of 86 after a brief but valiant battle with lymphoma. He and his wife, Roslyn, married in Denver in 1964 and enjoyed a wonderful life together for 59 years. In addition to his wife, Mort is survived by children Michelle Brennan (Terry) and David Cohen (Robin), and grandchildren Jared Brennan, Lilah Cohen, Dahlia Cohen, and Gabriel Cohen.

In 2017 Mort and Roslyn moved to Ashby Ponds, an Erickson Continuing Care Community in Ashburn. Mort often said this was the smartest decision they had ever made. He exercised regularly at the gym, loved to walk around the beautifully-landscaped grounds, fountains, and ponds, and was known in the Current Events discussion group as one of the members who always made well-thought-out contributions to discussions on any topic.

Mort retired from the military, attaining the rank of Lt. Col. in the U.S. Army, followed by an additional period of government service with the Defense Intelligence Agency. Remembered by friends and family as having a great sense of humor, often cynical, this cynicism helped him in his true love -- political cartooning. The political affiliations didn't matter to him. He loved picking out the 'stupidity' in what he thought our elected officials were doing. Along with his political doodling, he was a reader of biographies and history - a man always wanting to learn more. Even his ability to draw was something he developed on his own, never having taken an art class. His cartoons can
