



Richard Glenn "Dick" Hawthorne, Jr.

March 12, 1940 - January 27, 2013

an Alexandria area businessman for more than 39 years died of a massive brain aneurysm on Sunday, 1/27/13. Mr. Hawthorne grew up in Herndon, VA. He attended Herndon High School followed by The College of William and Mary and George Washington University. From 1962 to 1968 he served in The United States Marine Corps Reserves. From 1963 to 1977 he was a salesman for G.L.Cornell CO, a distributor of golf course and commercial turf maintenance equipment. From 1974 to 1998 he owned and operated Baskin-Robbins ice cream franchises and a restaurant, Muldoon's in the Richmond Hwy. corridor of southeastern Fairfax County. From 1989 until his death he was a manufacturer's representative in the advertising specialty industry. His marriage to Joel Ann Hawthorne ended in divorce in 1974. He is survived by his mother Jane Hawthorne, two sisters, Allyn Trautman (Robert) and Anne Casali (Rick), his daughter Holly Brown and her husband Robert, his son Richard Glenn Hawthorne III "Rick", daughter Kelly Hawthorne, and grandchildren Chad, Trent and Josie Brown. A devoted son, father, grandfather, and proud American he was known for his warm and generous spirit, sharp intellect, and quick wit.
