“ I was a student of Professor Klein's at Edward Williams College in Hackensack, NJ in 1971. I will never forget his elegant and brilliant way of teaching philosophy. My introductory course with him gave me a lifelong interest in the field of philosophy. If not for intervening life situations I would have pursued a Ph.D. and gone into teaching philosophy -- largely driven by the strong interest his teaching gave me. I did major in Philosophy and transferred later to N.Y.U. where I did some informal graduate studies. I re-established contact with Professor Klein over the phone many years later, in 2001. And in later years, until about 2019, we occasionally kept in touch via email. He sent me his books and articles and it was a great delight and pleasure to be back in touch with him.
