At Upfront Productions she contributed to many successful tours, among them: U2, The Rolling Stones, Genesis, The Grateful Dead, ZZ Top, Santana, David Bowie and Metallica, as well as major festivals including Farm Aid, Lollapalooza and Woodstock II. Tina established her reputation for leadership, hard work and determination in this "Dream Job" that she loved, where she and her influence is still respected and appreciated decades later. Tina later received a Certificate of Excellence in further studies from Parks College, finishing on the President's List. Among her countless achievements, her victory in her battle with Alcoholism throughout her final year was her greatest. Loving wife to Ron. Caring mother to Doug.
