She gave even when she did not have to give. Self-less was she. She fed the hungry and sheltered the homeless. She was also a Life Member of the VFW and a member of the Red Hat Society.

Vera was born and raised in West Virginia. She was one of twelve siblings. She has four surviving sisters and brothers: Mary Lou Lambert, Ann Jo Hartman, Cranston Sponaugle, Issac Sponaugle. Vera loved her family deeply and enjoyed spending time with them at their annual family reunion held in West Virginia for over 50 years. Vera cherished her nieces and nephews and her relationship with each and everyone one of them. She looked forward to birthday parties, anniversary celebrations, weddings, graduations, and the arrival of all her great-grandchildren. She did not miss an event!

Meemaw also enjoyed traveling. She has traveled to Hawaii, California, Texas, Maine, Florida, New York, and Indiana to name a few, over the years including to her recent trip to Florida in February 2013.
