



Vicki Maria Stevenson Mitchell

June 5, 1947 - January 19, 2013

Vicki M. Mitchell, 65, a computer programmer who retired from Airline Tariff Company in 2007, died peacefully at home surrounded by family on Jan 19. Vicki fought a nearly 23 year battle with lymphoma and complications resulting from the disease.

Vicki was a native of Salt Lake City and a 1970 graduate of the University of Utah. In 1978 she earned a Masters in Teaching from Jacksonville University.

In January of 1970, Vicki married Bill Mitchell and their 43 year marriage was blessed by three children, Melanie, Sherri, and Scott and five grandchildren: Grant (15), Ryan (9), Caitlin (5), Brooke (3), and Jake (4mo). After Bill's retirement from the Navy, the family moved to Springfield VA, where they have resided for the last 29 years.

Vicki was active in raising funds for the fight against cancer through Relay for Life, and volunteered at Fairfax Hospital and Springfield Estates Elementary School.

Vicki was an avid family photographer and chronicler. She spent countless hours documenting the lives of her family and assembling photograph albums for each of the children and grandchildren.

In addition to her husband, children and grandchildren, Vicki is survived by her brother, Richard Stevenson of New York.
