Not only was it "standard practice" for Bill to make a personal visit, but it was always a pleasant surprise knowing how really busy he was in this agency. Well, Bill asked questions about my problem and began to test some systems for possible solutions. However, the highlight of the visit which turned out to be about 1 1/2 hours was that he talked lovingly about his family, its large size consisting of brothers, sisters, nieces and nephews. He also talked about the people he had met over the years who kindly shared their knowledge with him about various things which he used to help his family in small ways. His comments about his family, how much they meant to him and how much he really enjoyed doing as much as he could for any of them was what really caused him to "beam" during our time together. How saddened I was to learn later in the week that he had not only been sick, hospitalized, but that he passed still leaves me so sad. I have had an opportunity to receive Bill's wonderful, customer focused guidance before. Somehow, this last time with him was so much more meaningful because he talked about how much he cared for his family in a way that was and to this day, so touching and warm. God rest his soul and may this small message bring some source of comfort to you, his family. I miss him.*

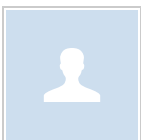

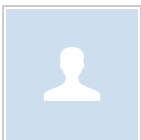
